

October 19, 2025 In Attendance: Pastor Stephen, Jacob P., Mike S., Lee M., Bob B., Penny S., Lynn W., Sandy T., Jim W. and Jason S.

- **1. Meeting called to order**. Meeting opened with prayer by Mike.
- **2. Approval of September Minutes**; Motion to approve by Sandy, second by Lee. Motion carried, minutes approved as read.
- 3. Committee Reports:

Elder's Report

- Bob reported that after reviewing the changes proposed to the by-laws, the elders recommended not approving the changes. Mike added that we are required to present the changes as indicated to the congregation for a vote. He will explain the proposed changes before calling for the vote. Bob said at the congregational meeting he will make a motion to have the proposed changes voted separately.
- The Elders have made that decision for St. John to rescind our participation in Regional Council. The Elders feel that due to the Council becoming an Interfaith organization, we are withdrawing. We may still choose to participate within the small groups of the organization. A letter of our choice to rescind has not yet been sent to the Council. (continued on next page)

Properties Report

- Mark indicated that the carpet installation upstairs will begin this week, the bibles and hymnals being removed today. Church services will be held in the Fellowship Hall until the project is completed. Carpeting of the downstairs Fellowship Hall is planned for mid January, after the holidays.
- Discussion on the boiler unit Mark said the boiler is running and Jeff has been working on this project. A new motor is scheduled to be installed and the boiler should be expected to run for another 15 or 20 years.

Treasurer's Report (see page 2)

- Penny reported that with the hiring of Brandy for the nursery each Sunday, the \$800 budgeted for this position will be depleted by probably March. It was noted that there are additional funds in "Morgan's/Pastor's Fund" budgeted to cover the additional expense through the fiscal year. This expense should be addressed in the new budget.
- If anyone is using the church Venmo account for sales, be sure to indicate in the comments what the charge is for. The QR code can be obtained from the office for event sales.
- The amount of \$10,000 has been moved from the Thrivent account to cover expenses.
- •Penny indicated that last month's offerings are less than our budget requires, but that this varies each month.
- •Jacob reported that with all monies coming in for the National Youth Convention, there is now \$203.50 remaining in the account. Inoperable cards have not yet been replaced.
- It was noted that there are funds available to pay for the new furnace to be installed in the Hope House.

Social Ministries

- Last months' potluck was very well attended and the October potluck is scheduled for next Sunday, Oct. 26th.
- Advent by Candlelight is scheduled for Dec. 4th at St. John. Tickets will go on sale the first Sunday in Nov.
- Both Lynn and Sandy will be gone for the Voter Meeting in November and unable to arrange the luncheon.

4. Old Business

Bylaw Changes - Changes to the bylaws must be presented to the congregation as shown two weeks prior to the Congregational Meeting. In order for the bylaw to remain unchanged as the Elders recommended, the proposed revision must not pass with majority. Mike will meet with Beth to provide clear explanations of the proposed changes to the congregation, those in attendance and the voting membership. These need to be presented by November 2nd to meet the 2-week requirement. Mike will email the board these changes by next week.

Hope House - The furnace is currently working but is over 40 years and should maybe be replaced. The two bids Jim received are \$5,300 from First Call Jewel and \$6,700 from Conan Heating & Air Conditioning. The unit from Jewel is new but has been in stock for quite some time thus allowing them to give us a better price. It still has the full warranty. After discussion on replacing the unit now or waiting, Mark made a motion for First Call Jewel to replace the unit now before it becomes a necessity. Motion seconded by Lee. Motion passed. Jim noted that a new guest has moved into the Hope House.

IT Professional Position - Jacob recommended that we revisit this position at the next fiscal budget.

5. New Business:

Approval of the Property Use Form for the Thanksgiving Potluck Dinner to be held in the Fellowship Hall. This event had previously been approved by email.

Request was made by a member to use the church for a rock band practice on any available evening. After discussion, the board was concerned the sound might disturb neighbors and decided to decline the request. Preparation of the agenda for the Congregational Meeting. Mike will post the meeting announcement.

Discussion on who approves the Property and Facility Single Use Requests. These requests will still be presented to the Board of Directors for approval.
