<u>Jesus Joins Us</u>

He meant to pass by them, but when they saw him walking on the sea they thought it was a ghost, and cried out, for they all saw him and were terrified. But immediately he spoke to them and said, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid." And he got into the boat with them, and the wind ceased. And they were utterly astounded, for they did not understand about the loaves, but their hearts were hardened.

Mark 6: 48-52

In July our Gospel reading brought us into the boat that the twelve disciples were laboring in all night to row across the sea of Galilee because Jesus sent them ahead. Jesus stayed behind to spend time in prayer with his Heavenly Father. Mark, the Gospel writer, tells us that Jesus intended to pass them by as He caught up with them by walking on the sea.

But the disciples caught sight of him and were terrified. Out of compassion Jesus enters the boat with them. We might be surprised to see the disciples in a state of terror and with hardened hearts. But this understanding we are given of their thoughts, emotions and heart-condition gives us hope.

We might wonder to ourselves, "How could they be fearful?" After all, in the chapters leading to this account on windy seas, the twelve have seen Jesus cast out demons, heal the sick and diseased, and heal those with diseases that isolated them from healthy people. He healed withered limbs and skin diseases. He healed a woman who had sought medical help for twelve years, he fed over five thousand people from five small loaves and two fish, and he raised to life a twelve-year-old girl who had died. And still the disciples were terrified and their hearts were hardened.

R. Alan Cole writes: Hardness of Heart is that lack of spiritual perceptivity, that lack of readiness to learn. Smallness of faith is a failure to remember God's working in the past and to apply that knowledge of his nature to our present problems.

The twelve were eyewitnesses of Jesus' teachings, miracles and authority yet they did not apply all of this to the anxiety-producing hours of their own lives. This is good news for us because of how Jesus dealt with them. In love he still came

compassionately to them in their unnecessary fear. He still came to them in their immature faith and discemment.

And Jesus does not cast them aside in their failure. He gets into the boat and continues to teach them through his words and actions of his abundant grace, mercy, forgiveness and love. And Jesus continues to do so for us when we become fixated on our own troubles even when they feel insurmountable and far too numerous to even attempt to unravel.



The disciples would grow in faith and understanding. They would grow in hope and certainty. They would benefit again and again because Jesus climbed in and shared with them his presence.

And Jesus continues to share his presence with us. His work is not done in us, but his love is enough to grow us and to make us more and more certain of his unlimited love for us. **We are loved!**
