Burden Lifted–Freedom Given

For David, after he had served the purpose of God in his own generation, fell asleep and was laid with his fathers and saw corruption, but he whom God raised up did not see corruption. Let it be known to you therefore, brothers, that through this man [Jesus] forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you, and by him everyone who believes is freed from everything from which you could not be freed by the law of Moses. [Acts 13:36-39]

On Independence Day Americans celebrate our freedom from other powers that would rule us. Perhaps you have heard guests on Dave Ramsey's radio show who are given airtime to celebrate their freedom from indebtedness by shouting excitedly, "We're debt freeeee!!!" It is energizing to hear their exhilaration.

God's word uses different words to describe how we have failed to live out His will which brings condemnation upon us.

One such word is iniquity, a word that is rarely used today.

What is iniquity?

In Hebrew iniquity is avon and is related to the Hebrew word avah. These words describe poetically the bent, twisty and crooked results of our sin. Punishment in Scripture literally means that God lets one sit under the weighty consequences of his own iniquity (avon) and sin.

BUT God also reacts by choosing to carry upon Himself the avon of his people as an act of pure mercy. King David writes, *I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord," and you forgave the iniquity of my sin.* [Psalm 32:5] God didn't carry the iniquity or avon of His people and place it in some huge landfill; no, God placed our crushing iniquity on his Son who bore it all for us that it would no longer crush us.

How heavy was the iniquity of the world? Isaiah says that the suffering servant to come "was crushed" by it. But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed.

[Isaiah 53:5]

Author Thomas Watson writes, To forgive sin, is to take away iniquity. '*Why dost thou not take away mine iniquity?*' [Job 7:21]. The Hebrew, says 'lift off.' It is a metaphor taken from a man that carries a heavy burden which is ready to sink him, and another comes, and lifts it off, so when the heavy burden of sin is on us, God in pardoning, lifts it off from the conscience, and lays it upon Christ. '*He has laid on him the iniquity of us all*'. [Isaiah 53:6]

In Acts 13 we are given the account of Paul and Barnabas being invited to speak in the synagogue of Antioch in Pisidia following Scripture readings from the Law of Moses and the Prophets.

Paul takes the invitation to tell Jews and gentile proselytes to Judaism that Jesus is the prophesied descendant of King David who is the fulfillment of promises given to the king. And this king, Jesus, will reign for eternity. And his reign is a gracious one that gives us everlasting freedom from what held us down.

This king would take the cumulative weight of our crushing iniquity and lift it from our shoulders forever. Through this man [Jesus] forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you, and by him everyone who believes is freed from everything from which you could not be freed by the law of Moses.

[Acts 13:38-39]

The Law of Moses could not acquit, declare innocent, or clear sinners of a single charge against them. It could not justify, but only press charges, demonstrate our guilt, and condemn us. [Peoples Bible Commentary: Acts]

No, the Son acquits, declares innocent, clears sinners, lifts our iniquity onto himself and makes us eternally right with God the Father.

***Below are some reasons we as Christians are encouraged to give an offering as a part of our Worship to God, as well as options for ways to contribute. It is not the BOD's intention to offend anyone or cause guilt, just to share information.

The Reason for Tithes and Offerings: "God wants our devotion. He wants our hearts. We need to give our tithes and offerings because through them we express our love and devotion and thanks to God for his love for us. The offering is an act of worship." (Excerpt From: Lutheran Witness contributor Tom Raabe April 10, 2019)

"Christ's love empowers his people to give generously. It flows freely from Christ "who loved us and gave himself up for us" (Ephesians 5:2). Our generous giving to God is a response to Christ's willing sacrifice for us. Finally, tithing serves New Testament Christians as a benchmark for proportionate giving. The Apostle Paul said, "...each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with your income" (1 Corinthians 16:2). As New Testament Christians, tithing is a practice to be engaged in freely rather than a requirement to be met legally." (Excerpt From: St. Paul's Ev. Lutheran, Stevensville, MI (https://www.stpaulswels.org/page/10-for-10#:~:text=Our%20generous% 20giving%20to%20God,1%20Corinthians%2016%3A2)

Some giving potential percentages include, but are not limited to: 1%, 3%, 5%, 7%, 10%, and 12%. Giving of time and talents are always welcome as well. If you haven't given an offering previously, but feel led by the Holy Spirit to begin, you may want to try the *One-Step-Up Method.* This method is where you choose to give a set dollar amount / percentage each week. You may eventually choose to increase your offering as God leads you.

Options for Giving at St. John

General Fund Giving: Offerings may be placed in the plate during Worship, mailed to the office, or given electronically using VANCO. To use VANCO, simply go to the St. John web site: https://www.stjohnministries.net and click on the "Online Giving" button in the banner on the home page. You can also download the VANCO Mobile app for free from the App Store or Google Play. You can choose to give a one-time gift or set up a recurring gift as often as you like. If you have any questions, please call the office. **Benevolence Fund:** St. John, in the exercise of it's religious and charitable purposes, has established a Benevolent Fund to assist persons in financial need. The church welcomes contributions to the fund. In order for donations to be tax deductible, donors may only designate use of their contributions to the Benevolent Fund, not individuals. The administration of the fund including all disbursements is subject to the control and discretion of the Benevolent Fund Committee and/or Board of Directors. Contribution to the Benevolent Fund. Fund Sourd of Directors. Contribution to the Benevolent Fund.

Benevolent funds are used to help with medical bills, shelter, utilities, etc. Since many Christian churches in our community have a Benevolent fund, we sometimes will partner with other churches to help people. In addition to our Benevolent fund, St. John contributes to FISH (Friends in Service Here) & The Soup Kitchen, so we avoid duplicating those services with funds from our benevolent fund.

The funds given to those in need are given directly to the landlord, doctor office, etc. and not made out to the person in need or made out to cash. The benevolent fund should always be used to help people in a way that does not contribute to a welfare mentality. To that end, assistance given from the Benevolent fund is to remain a gift, but people can be encouraged to give thanks and take pride in their own ability by helping others once their crisis has been relieved.
