Mutual Encouragement at Home

In Bible Study on Sunday mornings we are watching the series, *The Chosen*. The genre is historical Christian fiction. The producers want to support the truth and intention of the Scriptures. In class we discuss the portrayal of the biblical characters and biblical events and look at what we know of them from God's Word.

There is a beautiful interaction to begin the series between the child Mary Magdalene & her father.

Dad: What do we do when we are scared?

M.M: We say the words.

Dad: Adonai's [the Lord's] words from the prophet.

M.M: Isaiah.

Dad: The Prophet Isaiah, right!


But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. [Isaiah 43:1]

As Mary has great difficulties as an adult, the series provides flashbacks in which Mary remembers her dad's confidence in God's Word, and her thoughts are once again directed to our powerful, merciful and redeeming Heavenly Father.

Martin Luther was fond of teaching people to pray the Word of God back to him. He shared this idea: An important step in daily prayer that is often overlooked is that after meditating on the Scripture, take time to 'pray the text' before moving on to more free-form prayer.

We can pause before dinner as individuals or families and share a short verse or portion of God's Word, thank Him for a particular quality or blessing, and then ask His blessing on our home and food.

Perhaps start with Isaiah 43:1. Daily say this verse out loud, ponder together its meaning and use it to thank God. For example, "Lord God, we are so grateful to belong together as a family, and we rejoice that You claim us as Your own. We belong to You, and we thank you for the gift of each other and the gift of this food You have given for us to share. We pray in the name of the Father, Son & Holy Spirit. Amen."

One could dwell on 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 all month. Colossians 3:13, John 15:12-13 are also wonderful verses that will guide you to consider God's provision and presence in your life and to thank Him.

History Matters! We are pleased to report that the National Park Service has approved our application to include the St. John Lutheran Church building on the National Register of Historic Places. This formal recognition of the historical and architectural significance of our building, completed in 1949, was just over three years in the making and required support from the City of Idaho Falls Historic Preservation Commission, the State Historic Preservation Office, support during the application preparation by a professional architect and an architectural historian, and letters of support from Mayor Rebecca Casper and State Representative Linden Bateman. The gothic design, world-class stained glass, and the fact that we have maintained the historical integrity of the building over many years played no small role in our successful listing.
