In Romans 12:2 Paul writes, **Do not** be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.


Jesus and Paul use the word "world" to encapsulate human life and society that is opposed to God and his will and ways. In this instance it points to life that is motivated by sin, evil desires and our spiritual enemy.

People tend to conform to what they spend valuable time with—what we view, listen to or interact with online. And algorithms in multimedia and social media make sure we are fed a buffet of what we want to hear, see and read about. And a banquet is served of

the ills of those we oppose. In our human when someone points their nature we are easily conformed or imprinted by these things we give our attention to. And soon we are far from the daily good that God desires to bring to others through us.
